

Leadership Lewisville Class Project Policies

The Class Project is a vital part of the overall Leadership Lewisville Program. It is intended to be a “gift” back to the community from each class. With the help of the Class Facilitator and the Class Steering Committee, the project is to be determined by each class at the beginning of their program year and is to be completed by May 1st of said program year. In order to help insure the successful completion of the class project, the following policies are to be strictly adhered to:

- > each individual class member must devote a *minimum* of eight (8) hours of work to the class projects.
- > the project should benefit the citizens of Lewisville in some manner.
- > if there are any “outside of the class time” meetings, a member of the Steering Committee must attend said meetings.
- > there is to be absolutely no fund raising or solicitation of funding, including from the class itself, without the prior written approval of the President of the Lewisville Area Chamber of Commerce.
- > if any fund raising is approved, it must be communicated to all potential contributors that this is for a specific class project and not for the program as a whole.
- > the project must be defined by the end of the February class meeting in order to help insure completion by May 1st.

The class is encouraged to seek a project that will create a sense of “community” among its members while providing a valuable benefit to the Lewisville community. There is no requirement that the project be completed in one day or one weekend, but only that it be completed by May 1st.
